

Any student not in compliance with physical and immunization requirements will not be allowed to start school. If proof of a doctor's appointment is shown the student may remain in school until the appointment date. All appointments must be before 10-15-08. **Physical exams are needed within one year of starting kindergarten, 6th and 9th grades.** *Sports physicals* are required for anyone participating in an extracurricular sport. These are valid for *one year* from date of physical.

**The following checklist includes all the items needed to be in compliance.
Please bring it with you to the doctor.**

Must be filled out on 2 sided form

Parents/Guardian must fill out questions and sign

Doctor must check permission for physical education

Doctor must sign and date form- stamp is not acceptable unless it is a signature stamp

Immunization entry must be signed and dated

Height, weight and blood pressure must be entered on the form

Physical exam must be dated within one year of starting pre-school, kindergarten, fifth grade and ninth grade

Lead screening is required for children below the age of six years

Dpt – 4 or more doses with the last dose being on or after the 4th birthday. Doses must be no less than 28 days apart and the interval between dose 3 and 4 must be at least 6 month.

If a child is entering school for the first time at over 6 years of age DT may be substituted for Dpt as Pertussis vaccine is not medically recommended for children 7 years of age or older.

If 10 years have elapsed since the final Dpt was give a booster of Td is required.

Opv 3 or more doses with the last dose being a booster on or after the 4th birthday. If the immunizations are a mix of ipv and opv then 4 are required.

All doses of polio vaccine must be no less than 28 days apart.

Measles 2 doses of live measles vaccine with the first being on or after the first birthday and the second no less than 28 days later.

Mumps 1 dose of mumps vaccine on or after the first birthday

Rubella 1 dose of rubella vaccine on or after the first birthday

Hepatitis B Children entering fifth grade after 1997 must show proof of having 3 vaccines for hepatitis b. The first 2 doses must be no less than 28 days apart. The interval between the second and third dose must be at least 2 months. The interval between doses 1 and 3 must be at least 4 months. If a child receives 2 doses of adult vaccine and is 11-15 years at the time a third dose is not required.

Varicella 1 dose administered on or after the first birthday for children entering kindergarten from 2002 on. Children entering preschool must show proof of one dose on or after their first birthday. For 05-06 children entering k, 1,2,3 must meet this requirement.
