## **SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY**

Round Lake Senior High School, a four year comprehensive school is located just south of the Wisconsin border in Lake County, Illinois. The community is largely suburban residential with some light industry. Our school serves a diverse population which now numbers 57% Latino, 31% Caucasian, 8% African-American, 3% Asian, and 1% Multi-Racial. Serving students from Round Lake, Round Lake Beach, Round Lake Park, Round Lake Heights, and Hainesville, Round Lake Senior High School has enrolled approximately 1,900 students for 2009-2010 with 405 graduating. Round Lake Senior High School is accredited by the State of Illinois and the North Central Association.

## **PROGRAM OF STUDIES**

Round Lake Senior High School offers several honors and advanced placement courses; these are accelerated courses that requires students to work independently and demonstrate high levels of critical and analytical thinking.

**AP Programs:** English Literature and Composition, English Language and Composition, Calculus, Physics, Spanish Language, U.S. History 1, U.S. History 2, Government, and Studio Art

We continue to offer several honors courses in each of our core subject areas that demand high levels of cognitive and problem solving processes. The instructional pace is rigorous and emphasizes curricular depth, breadth, and enrichment.

**CLASS RANK:** A student's class rank is computed from semester grades earned on a cumulative basis beginning with the freshman year. P.E., band, and chorus are calculated in the GPA.

## **EDUCATIONAL ADVANCEMENT**

**Schuler Scholar Program:** The Schuler Scholar Program (SSP), through enrichment and academic programs, guidance and scholarships, prepares high potential students to succeed at selective colleges. **Technology Campus:** Students enroll at the campus on an elective basis in their junior and senior year. Through the career education offered at the campus, students can become certified in various concentrations that include, but are not limited to culinary arts, cosmetology, and emergency medical technician by their high school graduation.
